## MACMILLAN PIER

<u>Individual Mooring Permits</u>	<u>Fee</u>
<u>BY LENGTH OF VESSEL:</u>	
Vessels Equal to and Less Than 16 ft.	\$50
Vessels Greater than 16 ft.	\$100
Vessels Greater Than 20 ft.	\$125
Vessels Greater Than 30 ft.	\$175
Vessels greater than 40 ft.	\$200

Holding Mooring Permits \$100  
 (Required for those with assigned pier and floating dock spaces)

Please note: All mooring buoys shall be white with a horizontal blue stripe, in accordance with federal standards, of sufficient size to carry the weight of the mooring gear and remain fully buoyant. Mooring #s should be permanently marked on the mooring ball. The anchor to buoy chain should be long enough to accommodate our 14 ft. neap tides.

Senior Citizens: There is a 50% discount of the required fee for all Provincetown Residents aged 65 years and older. Positive proof required for first year of qualification.
